Master's or PhD (in progress) degree in Mathematical Finance, Actuarial Science. Statistics or related discipline. Prior experience teaching at the university level. Note: Applicants may be asked to supply references. First consideration will be given to full-time graduate students at the University of Toronto.

Past teaching experience is the more relevant criterion than the need to acquire experience in respect of this posted position.

Duties

The instructor will prepare and teach 6-7 modules of 2 hours each that will be recorded and posted on Quercus by the 1st of June 2025. The material covered will be: theory of mathematical finance and stochastic calculus. Examination: there will be a final project. Students will be required to do a presentation in groups.

Duties of this position shall be performed on the St. George campus.
